

officials within the courthouse. The Police Officer shall follow the policy of each Judge regarding the handling of weapons in the courtroom.

- May NOT be armed anywhere within the building when they are on personal business.
- Plain clothed officers who are on official business must wear a clearly visible identification badge, designating them as a Certified Peace Officer.

County Attorney's Office Investigators:

- As long as they are Certified Peace Officers, the same standards as above apply.
- Lock boxes should be provided within the County Attorney's Office for when those Investigators are working within the office and choose to remove their weapons.

Probation and Surveillance Officers:

- As long as they are on duty, probation officers and surveillance officers may be armed anywhere within the building, EXCEPT in courtrooms and EXCEPT in Judges' chambers.
- If the officers are off duty, or if the officers are in the courthouse on personal business, they may NOT be armed anywhere within the courthouse.
- Because these officers are often dressed in street clothes, they must at all times wear their badge prominently next to their weapon.
